#### Over the next 12 months I hope to establish my imprint on the VTA and the way it works with the community, government and the industry.

"It feels a little strange to introduce myself as the new CEO of the Victorian Taxi Association (VTA) largely because I have been involved with the VTA, and the industry more broadly, for some time now."

t the outset I would like to pay tribute to the tremendous contribution former CEO Neil Sach. 19 years is a long time to dedicate oneself to such a role. I have very much enjoyed getting to know Neil and working with him.

Even in the relatively short time I have been working at the VTA many things have changed. Nothing, however, compares to what we have seen over the last two years with regard to the Victorian Taxi Industry Inquiry and its numerous recommendations. The VTA's substantive view on the key issues will not change as a result of Neil's departure and my arrival.

Our concerns remain the same. as do the aspects of the report we believe show merit. All of what we have had to say can be easily accessed via our website - I won't bore you by going into greater details here.

Inquiry outcomes aside, there are other areas I would like to focus on over the next 12 months.

Some are straight forward operational issues, like the need for a long overdue fare increase, and others relate to less tangible factors like trying to reinvigorate and balance the community's perception of our industry.

Importantly, the industry also

needs to be more involved in shaping the service that customers receive and expectations about the level of service we provide. The customer must remain the central focus.

It was pleasing to note at the end of 2012 that overall customer satisfaction with Victoria's taxi service sat at nearly 70 per cent. This is the highest level in six years and up from around 55 per cent at the beginning of the Taxi Industry Inguiry almost two years ago. Unfortunately our critics weren't as quick to congratulate us for this achievement as they're to condemn us for perceived shortcomings in the past.

As an industry we must continue to work to raise these standards even higher. Through service delivery improvements the industry will not only gain a much needed lift in short term revenue, but also greater credibility and confidence that will stand it in better stead to be offered, and seize, new opportunities.

Over the next 12 months I hope to establish my imprint on the VTA and the way it works with the community, government and the industry. I will have to spend some time over the coming weeks and months bedding down my staff structure and the direction I want to take. I am confident I can hit the ground running given my experience within the industry.

I also hope to be able to announce new initiatives and processes that will allow the VTA to better communicate with the industry at all levels. This will not be limited to metropolitan Melbourne, but also extend to our regional colleagues. Taxis are not limited to Melbourne and the great service regional taxi services provide should not be overlooked or forgotten.

Let me also state my commitment to building a strong and productive relationship with the government, particularly the soon to be established Taxi Services Commission.

While we must retain our ability to think and act independently in the interest of our industry and its customers, we must also recognise that we are a heavily regulated industry and meaningful dialogue between our industry and our regulators is vital to ensure an environment conducive to running a successful business.

An Indian taxi driver who sexually assaulted two Melbourne women while driving them home in separate incidents, believed Australian women are sexually available, a court heard.

Gurjit Singh, 28, did not appreciate the illegality of inappropriately touching intoxicated young female passengers, including one while he was contesting criminal charges over the other, County Court Judge Gabriele Cannon said.

"It's important for you, Mr Singh, to appreciate the very real consequences of your horrendous actions,"Judge Cannon said as she jailed him for at least six months.

She said he had breached the women's trust "in a most despicable way".

Around 1.30am on December 2, 2011 - less than a

month after he appeared in court over an earlier incident - he inappropriately touched a drunk 22-year-old woman and asked her to touch his genitals.

In May 2010, he began asking a 31-year-old woman he was driving home, personal questions, including whether she enjoyed sex. While stopped at a red light, Singh learnt over and squeezed the woman's breast hard and grabbed her inside thigh before she jumped out of the cab.

Singh denied the allegation, but later pleaded guilty to two counts of indecent assault. A rape charge was dropped.

Psychologist Jeffrey Cummins found Singh became frustrated when he had no sexual partner, compounded by his parents enforcing strict Sikh rules. The Indian national moved to Australia in 2006.

Mr Cummins said cultural factors played a part in the offending because Singh believed Australian women were more sexually assertive than Indian women.

Singh was jailed for a maximum of one year.



# Melbourne **Airport** Rail Link

The Victorian Coalition Government has confirmed a route for development of a rail link to Melbourne Airport after assessing 80 alternatives, with findings from the \$6.5 million Melbourne Airport Rail Link Study now available.

Speaking at the release of the study's findings and technical report, Minister for Public Transport Terry Mulder said the confirmation of the route was an essential step in providing a Melbourne Airport rail link.

"The Coalition Government has invested \$6.5 million in the essential pre-work for a rail link to Melbourne Airport," Mr Mulder said.

"We committed to ensuring that the best route was secured through a comprehensive investigation of rail link options.

"Public Transport Victoria has completed this work and found that a route known as the 'Albion East route' outperforms more than 80 alternative routes considered by the Melbourne Airport Rail Link Study.

The recommended Albion East route builds on the foundations of previous planning by using land reserved in 2001 for a new section of track. However, the study has





found that the 2001 design is no longer feasible as it cannot provide the capacity for rail services to the airport as well as increased services to cater for the unprecedented patronage growth occurring in this corridor

"A new Albion East design follows the 2001 route from the airport boundary via new tracks through reserved land and a freight corridor, but will use the existing rail tracks from Sunbury within the Sunshine corridor and connect with the Government's planned Melbourne Metro rail tunnel," Mr Mulder said.

"This new design will unlock airport access for people in Melbourne's south-east and CBD, with the connection via Melbourne Metro enabling people to use the planned Dandenong-Sunshine rail corridor to travel straight to Melbourne Airport.

"The Melbourne Airport Rail Link Study has taken into account previous planning for an airport connection and significant changes in our transport network over the last 10 years, including current and planned projects.

"Melbourne Metro will help to untangle our rail network, providing a generational improvement in rail services across the city.

"The recommended route for development of a Melbourne Airport rail link will tap into this transformation of Melbourne's rail network and achieve cost efficiencies by utilising significant infrastructure already being planned," Mr Mulder said.

Mr Mulder said Public Transport Victoria (PTV) would continue planning for a Melbourne Airport rail link and that the link would be included in plans for the expansion of Melbourne's rail network.

The Victorian Coalition Government is advocating for Commonwealth support for ongoing joint planning of this High-Speed Rail route linking the other east coast states with the CBD via Melbourne Airport. The Melbourne Airport Rail Study will continue to co-ordinate with the Commonwealth on this work.

# Customer Service Centre closed 8 April

Victorian Taxi Directorate (VTD) Customer Service Centre (CSC) will be closed on Monday 8 April. It will reopen on Tuesday 9 April with reduced services:

- Applications for driver accreditation can be accepted
- MPTP driver log in Personal Identification Number (PIN) codes can be changed and
- Industry Accreditation and Licensing documentation can be accepted.

The VTD are migrating all current driver accreditation data from the VicRoads system, to a new VTD system, the Victorian Taxi Management System (VTMS). Data will be migrated from the existing system on Saturday 6 and Sunday 7 April. On Monday 8 April, the system will undergo testing with external third parties including Victoria Police and card manufacturers.

### Interstate MPTP taxi vouchers

When Multi Purpose Taxi Program (MPTP) members travel interstate they can apply to the VTD for Interstate Vouchers.

These Interstate Vouchers ensure MPTP members still receive half price taxi travel wherever they are in Australia.

This is a reciprocal arrangement. When people visit Victoria with Interstate Vouchers issued in their home state or territory they must also be accepted by Victorian taxi drivers.

Yet feedback from some interstate visitors shows that this is not always the case – some Victorian drivers have refused to accept them.

Drivers are reminded that as part of licence conditions they are required to always accept Interstate Vouchers as part of the fare.

Interstate Vouchers do not cover the payment of the lifting fee to the driver/operator. Drivers are reminded that people who travel in WATs never pay this fee themselves, including passengers from interstate..

When a passenger does not have a MPTP (Wheel-chair/Scooter) Taxi Card (M31 card) the lifting fee is not paid. On these occasions, drivers are permitted to turn the meter on while loading/unloading passengers. This includes when carrying WAT passengers from interstate.





# Mobility aids in taxis

Wheelchair Accessible Taxis (WATs) have an important role in providing transport for passengers who use wheelchairs, scooters and other forms of mobility aids.

However, not all mobility aids can safely carry passengers in taxis. Scooters, princess, and other 'high care' type chairs are not suitable to be transported in WATs if the passenger is seated in them.

Passengers who use these forms of mobility aids may still be carried in WATs provided that:

- the taxi driver can safely restrain the mobility aid to prevent movement; and
- the passenger can transfer off the mobility aid into a fixed seat in the vehicle and use the seat belt provided.

Under no circumstances should a driver allow a passenger to travel while seated in a scooter, princess chair or other 'high-care' type mobility aid.

Passengers may travel while seated in wheelchairs provided that:

 the wheelchair is securely restrained by applying restraints to the floor from two points on the

- front and two points on the rear of the wheelchair frame:
- the passenger is secured by a seat belt fitted to the taxi and which has been properly adjusted and fastened in the manner in which the seat belt is designed to be worn; and
- the wheelchair is positioned with the occupant facing towards the front of the taxi and with the wheelchair located between the appropriate restraint attachment tracks/points on the floor.

To help drivers and passengers understand the requirements regarding the safe carriage of mobility aids in taxis, the VTD has refreshed its Carriage of mobility aids in wheelchair accessible taxis information sheet.

# VID update

### accreditation renewals

Industry accreditation renewals have now been sent to all operators, licence holders and network service providers whose accreditation is due to expire at the end of July 2013.

If yours is due to expire on

or before 31 July 2013 and you have not yet received your renewal notice please contact the VTD on 1800 638 802.

August and September renewals are planned to be posted in April 2013.

When completing your industry accreditation renewal, please ensure you read it carefully and complete all documentation, including all components of the statutory declaration.

#### **Protection Screens**

For safety and peace of mind, all drivers should use protection screens.

The only screen currently approved by the Victorian Taxi Directorate (VTD) for the Ford Falcon FG, is the Martin Bodyguard II MBGFG-CA taxi driver protection screen, supplied by Martin Meters of Tullamarine (ph 9335 1552).

Authorised officers of the VTD will be conducting audits of accredited operators to ensure that all regulatory requirements are being complied with, including the requirement to purchase and make available an approved screen for each vehicle.



#### **ASIC** searches

If you are supplying an Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC) extract to the VTD it is critical that the extract lists all the current company directors. ASIC extracts that are out of date or have incomplete information, will not be accepted.

#### Customer Service Centre

The VTD is currently experiencing a high volume of work in its Customer Service Centre (CSC) and advises that delays may be experienced for all counter transactions. The VTD CSC opening hours are 9.30am to 4.30pm. Waiting times are lower in the morning, so visit as early as you can.



# Have you had a serious health incident?



# At-risk people to get more information about protecting themselves

Just a fraction of people who have heart attacks receive mental health advice as they recuperate, despite the experience leaving them much more likely than the general community to develop depression or anxiety.

It comes as beyondblue and the Australian Healthcare and Hospitals Association release a new pamphlet, the first of its kind in Australia, to raise awareness about the increased mental health risks people face after a serious health issue has landed them in hospital.

beyondblue CEO Kate Carnell AO said factors associated with serious health scares such as shock, emotional trauma, lifestyle changes and lingering ill-health all contribute to the increased risk people face.

beyondblue-funded research that shows up to 50% of people who survive a heart attack or coronary artery disease then develop an anxiety condition, compared with 26% of the general population who will experience one over a lifetime.

But Ms Carnell said despite this,

only between 31% and 37% heart attack or coronary artery disease survivors receive information about how to cope emotionally as they recover.

"A recent analysis of people in a large Victorian town shows only about a third of people who've had a non-fatal heart attack or coronary disease get the mental health information they need, and this is not uncommon across the rest of Australia." she said. "This means thousands of Australians who urgently need guidance on how to protect themselves from mental illness miss out, despite being almost twice as likely to develop an anxiety condition when compared to the general population. They are also more likely to become depressed.

"In fact, anyone who is struck by a sudden serious illness is at increased risk. People need to know that a sudden health event can leave them emotionally vulnerable and this pamphlet shows the simple steps they can take to ensure they don't develop depression or anxiety. These pamphlets meet the urgent need to educate hospital patients about how they can protect themselves. People often make a full recovery from a physical illness, but their mental health suffers because they're not aware of the risks they face."

Australian Healthcare and Hospitals Association CEO, Prue Power AM, said the pamphlet will help teach people about typical emotional reactions, how to identify the signs and symptoms of depression and anxiety and how to tackle these conditions.

"This pamphlet contains simple and straightforward mental health advice that will be used by thousands of people," she said. "We are proud to be involved in the production of this pamphlet because it has the potential to help significantly in raising awareness of depression and anxiety."







# The waiting game

The last two years have been challenging for the taxi industry and it is important we all remember that there are taxi services that exist outside of Metropolitan Melbourne that face the same pressures as those within it. While many of the issues are the same, some differ.

Prices faced by country operators tend to fluctuate a great deal. For example, LPG and fuel costs, more generally, are often higher than Melbourne and tend to stav higher for longer. Even painting a taxi can be a vastly more expensive process. As I found recently.

The range of work taxis do in country areas also tends to vary a great deal. It is important to remember that in some country towns taxis are the only reliable form of non-personal transport. This means the taxis have to do a wide range of work to service the community. In turn the community becomes extremely reliant on the local taxi service.

Many often overlook these issues and fail to recognise that country taxis operate services that extend well beyond the traditional definition of what a taxi service is.

Country taxi people are proud of this fact, and it perhaps helps

to explain why we get somewhat upset when people quite unfairly criticise the role we play and our performance without bothering to properly understand it.

Despite these operational differences many of the issues and concerns that exist in Melbourne are the same as those in the country. Licence value will always be a contentious issue as will the level of fares and the number of taxis. At the moment many have, quite understandably, been focused on the Taxi Industry Inquiry and the Government's response to it. The problem in this respect is that there are a number of operational issues that are starting to impact on the sustainability of local taxi services just as harshly as the uncertainty surrounding the Taxi Inquiry recommendations.

Fare levels in Victoria remain stagnant. It is coming up to five years since we last saw an adjustment. This is obviously becoming an increasingly pressing issue and one that needs to be resolved as soon as possible. The VTD has had to delay decisions because it simply cannot commit to a position at this time of uncertainty. Just as concerning is their inability to recruit and fill vacancies which has seen an increase in waiting times for things like Driver Accreditation approval in country.

We understand that the Government want to take their time to ensure they make the right decisions reading the Inquiry recommendations and it is hard not to agree with this approach. However, some of the operational issues need to be addressed now, to ensure that country taxi services can continue to provide the great service that they do. Further, it is also important to help the industry in Melbourne retain and build on the latest customer satisfaction survey results of 69% - up from 50 odd per cent two years ago.

I urge readers not to forget about us out in the country. We face many of the same challenges faced by those in the city, and do a great job in this context. While we respect the Minister's desire to get this reform package right, we would also urge him not to forget about us. There are operational realities that really need to be addressed now.

### It's not just illegal drugs that are dangerous to drivers

- ▲ Always check warning labels, even if you have taken that drug
- ▲ Always ask your doctor or pharmacist if the medication you are going to use could impair your driving ability. There may be an alternative medication that does not impair your ability to drive safely;
- ▲ Don't drive if you are unsure of the effect of the drug on your ability to drive safely; and.
- ▲ Don't mix medication with other medication or alcohol, as this can seriously affect your health and your ability to drive safely. You may not feel intoxicated or impaired, but you could. in fact, be over the blood alcohol limit or in an unfit state to drive. 💠

WorkSafe Victoria has launched a major campaign to highlight the physical, mental and social benefits of injured workers getting back to work as soon as it is

The public awareness campaign highlights that injured workers who are off work for three months or longer face significant health risks. They include:

- Up to 10 times more episodes of anxiety and de-
- Greatly reduced life expectancy
- A higher risk of suicide

safe for them to do so.

On average, more than 28,000 Victorians are injured at work every year.

Of these about 6000 are still off work after three months and 3000 are off work for more than six months.

WorkSafe Victoria chief executive Denise Cosgrove said the health and wellbeing of injured workers declined dramatically after more than 12 weeks off work.

"International research and our own data tells us the chances of someone returning to work drops off around the three-month mark and, after six months, the chances of the worker ever returning to work are halved," Ms Cosgrove said.

"This alarming trend exposes them and their families to a range of increased health, financial and social risks.

"Getting back to work when it is safe and appropriate to do so is usually the best medicine for an injured worker, with research indicating that work is beneficial to their short and long-term mental and physical health."

Ms Cosgrove said the role played by an injured person's family and friends, employer, doctor and other medical professionals all played an important part in getting a person back to work.

"While an injured person's own determination to get back to work goes a long way, the support and encouragement of the people around them is vital. It's a team effort, but the benefits for injured workers and their families are enormous." she said.

WorkSafe's new Return to Work Ambassador, Paralympian Jack Swift, said he understood better than most the benefits of returning to work after injury.

He was just 21 and working as a plumber's labourer on an inner Melbourne construction site when a 14-tonne excavator ran over his right leg, crushing it below the knee. Conscious throughout the ordeal, Jack was rushed to hospital and his leg was amputated the next day.



Jack said the accident "absolutely turned my life upside down" and described the 13 months he was off work as the worst time of his life.

"I thought losing a leg was like being paralysed," Jack said. "I didn't think I'd be able to hang around my mates, play football, let alone return to work-I couldn't comprehend where my life was going.

"Now, I can do as much as, probably more, than many able-bodied people can do."

Jack said returning to work after a workplace accident could be difficult but, with the help of family and the correct medical support, it made him who he was today.

"I wouldn't be where I am today without the support I received from my employer, medical professionals, my family and my girlfriend Jenna. They were there every step of the way," Jack said.

"I've been in the shoes of an injured person returning to work after a workplace accident and I know the benefits - it's not just about financial benefits but also the physical, social and mental benefits." -
